►NEW RULES CHANGES

Animals with pending registration numbers after September 15, 2015, and January 5, 2016, will not be allowed to show
at the Mississippi State Fair, District Livestock Shows, and Dixie National Junior Round-Up, respectively, unless
extenuating circumstances are presented in writing to the Rules Committee within 5 days of the deadline date. Animal
registration information will be verified electronically before the show.

This means if you have exhibitors who nominate any registered animal (beef breeding; purebred dairy cattle; dairy goats) with pending information (name; registration number; etc.) by September 1, the exhibitor must turn in completed registration information to you by September 15 and January 5 in order to show at the State Fair and District/DNJR, respectively. You will then email the completed animal information to ADS.

2. This rule below pertains to some purebred dairy cattle exhibitors. The newly created Junior Dairy Show Affidavit is attached to this email.

A signed affidavit by the current owner, exhibitor, exhibitors' parent or guardian and Extension Agent or FFA Advisor stipulating to the fact that the exhibitor is in possession and has ownership of the animal for the purposes of showing at any Mississippi Junior Dairy Show for the dates recorded on the affidavit. All other rules concerning possession, housing and care of the animal would still apply as per Mississippi show rules and regulations. A copy of the affidavit and registration certificate must be sent to the ADS by the ownership deadline of September 1 and December 1. This is a one year pilot program for the 2015 MS State Fair and the 2016 District/Dixie National Junior Round-Up Livestock Shows.

When junior dairy exhibitors show a purebred dairy animal using the affidavit, they should have the ORIGINAL affidavit and a copy of their dairy animal's registration certificate in their possession.

► REMINDER: NEW 4-H/FFA MEMBERS MUST BE ETHICS CERTIFIED TO SHOW!!

The Mississippi State Fair will be here soon and the Mississippi Livestock Quality Assurance training for **NEW** exhibitors, parents or guardians, and volunteers must be completed by October 1, 2015. Code of Conduct Forms are to be requested from ADS.

► OFFICIAL HEALTH CERTIFICATE – REMINDER

An Official Health Certificate with each animal identified will be required on all livestock showing at the 2015 Mississippi State Fair. This includes all market animals, beef breeding cattle, commercial beef heifers, dairy cattle (purebred and commercial dairy heifers), dairy goats and commercial meat goat does.

► MISSISSIPPI STATE FAIR PREMIUM BOOKS

Each county will receive 2 Mississippi State Fair Premium Books in the county packet as soon as they are available. A PDF file of the premium book will also be sent by email and posted on the MSUcares.com website under the link for Livestock and then Youth Livestock. Please make sure your exhibitors and parents have a copy of the rules for the shows in which they participate. A copy of the schedule of events is included in this newsletter.

▶ DAIRY SWEETHEART CONTESTS AND MEAT GOAT PRINCESS CONTEST

A Junior and Senior Dairy Cattle Sweetheart, a Junior and Senior Dairy Goat Sweetheart, and a Junior and Senior Meat Goat Princess will be selected during the Mississippi State Fair. Winners will be selected based on poise, beauty, personality and knowledge of their project. The top 3 of each division will receive awards. Rules and regulations concerning the contest are found in the Mississippi State Fair catalog. Please have the entries to our office by September 18, 2015. Please encourage your girls enrolled in dairy and goat projects to enter this year. Winners will be announced according to times listed in the 2015 Mississippi State Fair Premium Book.

COMMERCIAL HEIFER AND MARKET STEER EXHIBITORS - SPECIAL NOTICE!

Check with your 4-H/FFA exhibitors that are exhibiting steers and commercial beef and dairy heifers about horns. All commercial heifers and steers showing at the Mississippi State Fair and District and Dixie National Junior Round-Up Livestock Shows must be polled or dehorned with no scurs or re-growth to exceed 1½ inches above the skin line. Remember the minimum weight on commercial heifers is 500 pounds for the Mississippi State Fair. ALL exhibitors are responsible for weighing their commercial heifers and market steers and declaring their animal's show weight on a weight card. Official scales will be made available for weighing livestock.

► MARKET GOAT EXHIBITORS – SPECIAL NOTICE!

Check with your 4-H/FFA exhibitors who are exhibiting market goats about horns. Goats may be shown that are polled, dehorned, or disbudded with no re-growth to exceed 1½" above the skin line. Removal of horns is not allowed on the show grounds. Remember the minimum weight of market goats is 40 pounds with no maximum weight for the Mississippi State Fair. ALL exhibitors are responsible for weighing their market goats and declaring their animal's show weight on a weight card. Official scales will be made available for weighing livestock.

COMMERCIAL MEAT GOAT DOE SHOW EXHIBITORS - SPECIAL NOTICE!

Remember the minimum weight of commercial meat goat does is <u>40</u> pounds with no maximum weight for the Mississippi State Fair. <u>ALL exhibitors are responsible for weighing their commercial meat goat does and declaring their animal's show weight on a weight card. Official scales will be made available for weighing livestock.</u>

► MARKET LAMB EXHIBITORS – SPECIAL NOTICE!

Remember the minimum weight of market lambs is <u>70</u> pounds with no maximum weight for the Mississippi State Fair. <u>ALL</u> exhibitors are responsible for weighing their market lambs and declaring their animal's show weight on a weight card. Official scales will be made available for weighing livestock.

► MARKET HOG EXHIBITORS – SPECIAL NOTICE!

Remember the minimum weight of market hogs is <u>200</u> pounds with no maximum weight for the Mississippi State Fair. <u>ALL</u> exhibitors are responsible for weighing their market hogs and declaring their animal's show weight on a weight card. Official scales will be made available for weighing livestock.

► COMMERCIAL DAIRY HEIFER EXHIBITORS – SPECIAL NOTICE!

Remember the minimum weight of commercial dairy heifers is 200 pounds for the Mississippi State Fair.
